- In 2014, Florida technical centers, vocational training schools run by the local school districts, began changing their names to replace "centers" with "college".
- The change led to a major upgrade to the image of what we are doing.
- Students and their families would rather say they are going to college.
- Get them in, Get them trained, Get them a job-funding





- In all, some 30 million jobs in the United States that pay an average of \$55,000 per year do not require a bachelor's degrees, according to the Georgetown Center on Education and the Workforce.
- The parents are definitely harder to convince because there is that stigma.
- Of the \$200 million that California is spending on vocational education, \$6 million is going into a campaign to improve the way people regard it.

But high school graduates have been so effectively encouraged to get a bachelor's that high-paid jobs requiring shorter and less expensive training are going unfilled.
